



# Hispanos son el grupo minoría mas grande de los EEUU


*...and Hispanics today make up 17% of the U.S. population, up from 13% in 2000*


**Two-thirds of Hispanics live in just five states...**



*...but five other states have seen the fastest growth since 2000.*




# Where Were Concentrations in 1980? Almost All 15%+ Counties Along Border



# Where Were Concentrations in 1990? Almost All 15%+ Counties Along Border, Still




# Where Were Concentrations in 2000? Fast Growth Away from Border



# Resultados de las elecciones medios términos en los EEUU


- Los republicanos ganaron control del U.S. Senado



### *Latinos as a percent of eligible voters, 2012*





*Latinos as a percent of eligible voters, 2012*












# La composición demográfica de votantes en las elecciones presidenciales



# La tasa de participación entre votantes elegibles en las elecciones presidenciales


Percent who reported voting among U.S. citizens ages 18 and older


# La afiliación con los partidos políticos entre votantes Latinos registrados
